Stop 1 - Start Here

Helps you determine whether you're eligible for special assistance and services by walking through key questions about disabilities and linking you to detailed definitions and next steps.



Stop 2 - Document Disability

Provides access to essential documents like IEPs and 504 plans so you can gather the paperwork needed to get specialized education services.



Stop 3 - Self-Advocacy

Discusses how to speak up for your needs and work toward independence in school, work, and life.



Stop 4 - Services for All

Outlines federal and state services available for students with disabilities and their parents.



Stop 5 - Specialized Services

Details the specialized services to help individuals access legal support, independent living skills, assistive technology, healthcare, transportation, and other resources tailored to their needs.



Stop 6 - Goals

Describes how you can set and achieve post-high school work and independence goals.



Stop 7 - Pre-Employment Services

Explains how you can use Pre-ETS to get ready for work after high school. It includes programs that practice social skills, build confidence, and explore careers.




Stop 8 - Supports in High School
