Qualified candidates may participate during the week to earn an Adapted Aquatics Instructor Certification.

AAI Candidate Requirements (five spots available):

- Must be a Learn-To-Swim Instructor certified through one of the following national organizations: the American Red Cross (WSI), YMCA of America, Swim America, or Starfish Aquatics Institute
- Able to attend approximately a half day of training the Sunday prior to camp start, as well as a minimum of one session each of the 5 days of camp.
- Experience teaching Learn-To-Swim lessons is preferred, but not required
